Update – Work & Organisational psychology

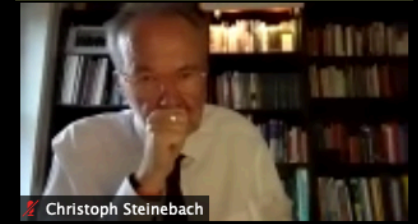
- 3 countries have S-NACs: Norway, Finland, and Spain
- Meeting planned for November, 2020
- Expressed interest in forming a S-NAC: UK
- Challenges:
 - Low market base of Basic EuroPsy holders – an exclusive ‘club’ of certificate holders
 - Difficulty in communicating the benefits for practitioners beyond recognition
 - The need for ensuring appropriate workload for attaining the specialist certificate
- Opportunities:
 - Providing a qualification route in settings where there is no formal training route for W&O
 - Recognition of continued development beyond practitioner training could be attractive to some – relies on clear application processes

Impact on Curriculum Development

The development of curricula in university programmes in psychology have been informed by the EuroPsy criteria at both undergraduate and postgraduate levels

At a University level:

In Poland, psychology programmes have become aligned with the EuroPsy standards

At a National level:

The Higher Education Act from May 2016 in the Czechia changed the system of accreditation of higher education study programmes. The Czechian NAC addressed The National Accreditation Office and requested that national accreditation standards continue to follow the EuroPsy regulations.

The Ordem in Portugal promoted the alignment of university training programmes in psychology with the EuroPsy criteria.

At a Professional level:

The national association in Lithuania is involved in developing a detailed description of EuroPsy competencies for the different fields of psychology (clinical and health, educational, work and organisational).
